SERMON: MARRIAGES ARE MADE IN HEAVEN! TEXT: Matthew 19:4-6 Introduction: The home is the backbone of society. Marriage is the most basic and influential unit in the world. The Biblical pattern for marriage works: thus, when a man and woman pledge their love for life. God is witness every time whether invited or not. Therefore, what God has joined, man must not separate. Consider...

Christ must be central - Colossians 3:1-4. This is the grand key to marriage. As Christians we are already married to Him (Rom. 7:4). However, when

Christ is the center of our marriage He graces our marital love!

- Cross must be focal Ephesians 5:23, 25. Marriage is about dying because that is what Christ did for His bride. In marriage a single man and a single woman die to self and the two become one. Thus, one plus one equals one! But, the ceremony is only the beginning of death! A Christian marriage is a lifelong practice of death...of giving over not all you have, but all you are!
- Covenant must be priority marriage is a covenant before God, according to Malachi 2:14, "she is the wife of thy covenant." It is a life-long commitment sealed with an oath before God; thus, every marriage enjoys two major benefits: security & growth. Security implies dependence: you can always count on each other. Growth implies advancement past the status quo; it involves growing in all areas.
- Commitment must be powerful Hebrews 13:4. Commitment is an outgrowth of covenant. Commitment is a powerful word and principle and should never be taken lightly. The way we show commitment is by what we put on. I.e., Colossians 3:14 – put on love! The truth is, marriages which depend on being "in love," fall apart - why? Love is an emotion and emotions are often unstable. But, those that build their marriage on commitment will make it and demonstrate love!
- Character must be penetrating Ephesians 5:25. Christ was committed to the church to the point of death – now, that's character. Character is who we are & who we are demands integrity. A husband that treats his wife well while loving & respecting her will be blessed. Women grace our world with beauty, tenderness & kindness. A loving wife is a blessing. The marriage of a loving man and loving women that strive to maintain Christian character in the home will be blessed in this life and the next.
- Cooperation must be consistent 1 Peter 3:7. When a married couple is headed in the same spiritual direction, serving the same Lord and abiding by the same standard of moral conduct, they will aid each other in reaching heaven as their eternal home. They must be "heirs together of the grace of life." A spiritual cooperative contribution to a marriage will help the spouse get to heaven.
- Caring must be bountiful Ephesians 5:28-31. The time honored phrase "the two shall become one flesh," is descriptive of oneness. Thus, if flesh is ever torn, that causes pain and when two are united and have difficulties pain occurs. However, a deep sense of caring and regular practicing of it strengthens marriage and sweetens the relationship.

Conclusion: Recent statistics caught my attention - 1 in 3 marriages end in divorce, 1 in 50 marriages (where the ceremony is in a church building) end in divorce, and 1 in 1105 marriages (who follow the Bible) ends in divorce. This just goes to show that when the Bible is our guide in faith and practice, life is MUCH better and eternity is MUCH brighter. Adapted - Mark N. Posey **SERMON:** The Wonderful Words of Life!

**TEXT:** 2 Timothy 3:14-17

Intro: Ronald Reagan said, "Within the covers of the Bible are the answers for all the problems men face." So true! It is our quide in all matters of FAITH and PRACTICE. Psalm 119:89 says, "Forever, O Lord, they word is settled in heaven." According to the text, Timothy had been taught the Bible from an early age. It guided him through life and illuminated his way. It will do the same for us; however, there are certain facts about the Bible that should always enthrall us. For, if the Bible had never been written, we would be most poor and desolate; however, people of all walks and stations of life have been made better because it was written. John Locke once said, "The Bible is one of the greatest blessings bestowed by God on the children of men. It has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth without any mixture for its matter. It is all pure, all sincere; nothing too much; nothing wanting." Notice what we learn from Paul as he wrote to Timothy about the "Book of Books."

- The Bible contains Holy Scriptures (v.15a). Literally, "sacred letters." Let us never be quilty of mistreating the Bible or handling it inappropriately! Its message is "consecrated for sacred use." Regardless of the form used: printed page, digital or memorized; the message should be reflected in our rightly handling of The Wonderful Words of Life!
- The Bible leads us to Salvation (v.15b). Humanities common problem is SIN; thus, our greatest need is the FORGIVENESS of sin! The Bible reveals the mind and purpose of God - i.e., Redemption of Humanity (Luke 1:68). God has provided for us in Jesus Christ reconciliation (2 Cor. 5:17-21) – our deepest need has been met! We are not saved by our mental accent to the contents of the Bible; we are saved by Grace through faith (Ephesians 2:8). God gives us His grace (2 Cor. 9:15) and we must in turn "receive" that grace by a living and obedient faith (2 Cor. 6:1; Heb. 5:9; Matt. 7:21). God's promise of eternal life is true and trustworthy, revealed and contained in the Bible (1 John 2:25); therefore, we can grow in confidence and assurance - Blessed Assurance (1 John 5:13). Thank God for The Wonderful Words of Life!
- The Bible is true and dependable (v.16a). The phrase "inspired of God" is literally "God breathed." God actually gave the writers their message (2 Peter 1:21). Cf. 2 Samuel 23:1-3; Jeremiah 1:9; Micah 3:8; Acts 1:16; Romans 1:16; 1 Cor. 14:37; 1 Thess. 2:13; et al. As Paul clearly stated: "For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you..." (1 Cor. 11:23). Remember, prayer is how we talk to God; the Bible is God talking to us! Praise Him for The Wonderful Words of Life!
- The Bible is profitable in all areas of living (3:16b). Lexicons use such words as "useful, beneficial, and advantageous" in defining the word "profitable." The true reverence of the heart and life for God is profitable (1 Timothy 4:8); also, good works of God's people are good and profitable to men (Titus 3:8). Thus, Scripture is profitable, useful, and beneficial in setting forth God's truth by which one's heart and life are governed. Paul gives Timothy a quartet of truths upon which to settle his life: doctrine (What is right!), reproof (Which is not right!), correction (How to get right!) and instruction in righteousness (How to stay right! The Wonderful Words of Life are alive and powerful!
- The Bible equips us for service (3:17). There is no magic formula, no short cut to spiritual maturity. As one faces a need in spiritual development, the words of Scripture underscore the importance and in turn quide in the attaining of this level, to be followed by the next level of maturity. Thereby the fully equipped man, ready unto every good work, is shaped & molded into Christ. The Wonderful Words of Life transform!

Conclusion: Scripture, God's inspired word, guides us in becoming & being the people of God. May we ever cherish and profit from it in life and trust it in death. It is our standard, our compass & our guide. MNP **SERMON:** "A Word Fitly Spoken is Like Apples of Gold..."
