Genesis 3:15

And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel.”

Identify who all the verse is talking about.

Genesis 12:3

I will bless those who bless you, and I will curse him who curses you; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.”

How are the families of the earth blessed?

Genesis 28:14

Also your descendants shall be as the dust of the earth; you shall spread abroad to the west and the east, to the north and the south; and in you and in your seed all the families of the earth shall be blessed.

How are we blessed?

Genesis 49:10

The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor a lawgiver from between his feet, until Shiloh comes; And to Him shall be the obedience of the people.

What is the scepter?

Numbers 24:17-19

“I see Him, but not now; I behold Him, but not near; A Star shall come out of Jacob; A Scepter shall rise out of Israel, and batter the brow of Moab, and destroy all the sons of tumult.¹⁸ “And Edom shall be a possession; Seir also, his enemies, shall be a possession, while Israel does valiantly.¹⁹

Out of Jacob One shall have dominion, and destroy the remains of the city.

Explain the prophecy here.

Deuteronomy 18:15

“The LORD your God will raise up for you a Prophet like me from your midst, from your brethren. Him you shall hear,

What are we to do today?

Deuteronomy 18:18.

I will raise up for them a Prophet like you from among their brethren, and will put My words in His mouth, and He shall speak to them all that I command Him.

What does God do for Jesus?

2 Samuel 7:12-16

¹² “When your days are fulfilled and you rest with your fathers, I will set up your seed after you, who will come from your body, and I will establish his kingdom.¹³ He shall build a house for My name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever.

¹⁴ I will be his Father, and he shall be My son. If he commits iniquity, I will chasten him with the rod of men and with the blows of the sons of men.¹⁵ But My mercy shall not depart from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I removed from before you.¹⁶ And your house and your kingdom shall be established forever before you. Your throne shall be established forever.”

Make the analogy with David and Jesus.

Isaiah 9:5-7

⁵ For every warrior's sandal from the noisy battle, And garments rolled in blood, will be used for burning *and* fuel of fire. ⁶ For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; And the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷ Of the increase of *His* government and peace There will be no end, upon the throne of David and over His kingdom, to order it and establish it with judgment and justice From that time forward, even forever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this.

Again make the analogy with David and Jesus.

Isaiah 7:14

Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel.

Who did Isaiah say would bear a child?

Isaiah 9:6-7

⁶ For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; And the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷ Of the increase of His government and peace There will be no end, upon the throne of David and over His kingdom, to order it and establish it with judgment and justice from that time forward, even forever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this.

The prophet said there would be P_____

Isaiah 11:1-5

A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. ² The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him-- the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of power, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD-- ³ and he will delight in the fear of the LORD. He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; ⁴ but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth. He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth; with the breath of his

lips he will slay the wicked. ⁵ Righteousness will be his belt and faithfulness the sash around his waist.

How does he explain Jesus?

Isaiah 11:10

“And in that day there shall be a Root of Jesse, Who shall stand as a banner to the people; For the Gentiles shall seek Him, and His resting place shall be glorious.”

How is Jesus a Root?

Isaiah 28:16

So this is what the Sovereign LORD says: "See, I lay a stone in Zion, a tested stone, a precious cornerstone for a sure foundation; the one who trusts will never be dismayed.

Why are we not dismayed?

Isaiah 29:13

Therefore the Lord said: “Inasmuch as these people draw near with their mouths and honor Me with their lips, but have removed their hearts far from Me, and their fear toward Me is taught by the commandment of men,

What happens to people who not really believe in God?

Isaiah 35:5-6

⁵ Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped. ⁶ Then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the dumb sing. For waters shall burst forth in the ⁶ All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, every one, to his own way; And the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all. ⁷ He was oppressed and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth; He was led as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so He opened not His mouth.

What was Jesus to do for us?

Isaiah 40:3-5

A voice of one calling: "In the desert prepare the way for the LORD; make straight in the wilderness a highway for our God. 4 Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. 5 And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all mankind together will see it. For the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

Who was the voice calling and what happened?

Isaiah 42:1-4

"Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him and he will bring justice to the nations. He will not shout or cry out, or raise his voice in the streets. 3 A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out. In faithfulness he will bring forth justice; 4 he will not falter or be discouraged till he establishes justice on earth. In his law the islands will put their hope."

Explain the characteristics of Jesus?

Isaiah 42:18-21

"Hear, you deaf; look, you blind, and see! "Here is my servant whom I have chosen, the one I love, in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him, and he will proclaim justice to the nations. 19 He will not quarrel or cry out; no one will hear his voice in the streets. 20 A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering

How is Christ portrayed here?

Isaiah 49:7

This is what the LORD says-- the Redeemer and Holy One of Israel-- to him who was despised and abhorred by the nation, to the servant of rulers: "Kings will see you and rise

up, princes will see and bow down, because of the LORD, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you."

What will nations do?

Isaiah 49:12 See, they will come from afar-- some from the north, some from the west, some from the region of Aswan."

Where will people come from?

Isaiah 50:6

I offered my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who pulled out my beard; I did not hide my face from mocking and spitting.

What did Christ do?

Isaiah 53:3-4

He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted.

What did Christ do?

Isaiah 53:5-7 (NIV) But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. 6 We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all. 7 He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

What was the disposition of Christ?

Isaiah 53:9-12

⁹ And they made His grave with the wicked— But with the rich at His death, because He had done no violence, nor *was any* deceit in His mouth. ¹⁰ Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise Him; He has put *Him* to grief. when You make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see *His* seed, He shall prolong *His* days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in His hand. ¹¹ He shall see the labor of His soul, *and* be satisfied. By His knowledge My righteous Servant shall justify many, for He shall bear their iniquities.

¹² Therefore I will divide Him a portion with the great, and

He shall divide the spoil with the strong, because He poured out His soul unto death, and He was numbered with the transgressors, and He bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Share your thoughts about what Jesus was to do?

Isaiah 58:6

“*Is* this not the fast that I have chosen: To loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo the heavy burdens, to let the oppressed go free, and that you break every yoke?”

Explain what Christ was to do.

Isaiah 61:1

“The Spirit of the Lord GOD *is* upon Me, because the LORD has anointed Me to preach good tidings to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to *those who are* bound;

What four things was Christ to do?

Isaiah 62:2-3

² The Gentiles shall see your righteousness, and all kings your glory. You shall be called by a new name, which the mouth of the LORD will name. ³ You shall also be a crown of glory In the hand of the LORD, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God.

What would the Gentiles see?

Isaiah 62:11

Indeed the LORD has proclaimed to the end of the world: “Say to the daughter of Zion, ‘Surely your salvation is coming; Behold, His reward *is* with Him, and His work before Him.’”

What is his reward?

Isaiah 63:1-6

¹ Who *is* this who comes from Edom, with dyed garments from Bozrah, This *One who is* glorious in His apparel, traveling in the greatness of His strength?— “I who speak in righteousness, mighty to save.” ² Why *is* Your apparel red, and Your garments like one who treads in the winepress?

³ “I have trodden the winepress alone, and from the peoples no one *was* with Me. For I have trodden them in My anger, and trampled them in My fury; Their blood is sprinkled upon My garments,

and I have stained all My robes. ⁴ For the day of vengeance *is* in My heart, and the year of My redeemed has come. ⁵ I looked, but *there was* no one to help, and I wondered that *there was* no one to uphold; Therefore My own arm brought salvation for Me; And My own fury, it sustained Me. ⁶ I have trodden down the peoples in My anger, Made them drunk in My fury, And brought down their strength to the earth.”

What is the day of vengeance?

Psalms 2:1-2

¹ Why do the nations rage, and the people plot a vain thing? ² The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD and against His Anointed.

What are the kings and rulers doing?

Psalms 2:6-7

⁶ “Yet I have set My King On My holy hill of Zion.” ⁷ “I will declare the decree: The LORD has said to Me, ‘You are My Son, Today I have begotten You.

What was the decree?

Psalms 16:8-11

⁸ I have set the LORD always before me; Because *He is* at my right hand I shall not be moved. ⁹ Therefore my heart is glad, and my glory rejoices; My flesh also will rest in hope. ¹⁰ For You will not leave my soul in Sheol, nor will You allow Your Holy One to see corruption. ¹¹ You will show me the path of life; In Your presence *is* fullness of joy; At Your right hand *are* pleasures forevermore.

What are the pleasures here?

Psalms 22:1

My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me? *Why are You so far from helping Me, and from the words of My groaning?*

When did this occur?

Psalms 22:7-8

All who see me mock me; they hurl insults, shaking their heads: ⁸ “He trusts in the LORD; let the LORD rescue him. Let him deliver him, since he delights in him.”

What will the Lord do?

Psalms 22:15-16

My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; you lay me in the dust of death. For dogs have surrounded Me; The congregation of the wicked has enclosed Me. They pierced My hands and My feet;

How was Christ pierced?

Psalms 22:18

They divide My garments among them, and for My clothing they cast lots.

When did this occur?

Psalms 31:5

Your hand I commit my spirit; You have redeemed me, O LORD God of truth.

How did God redeem Him?

Psalms 34:20

He guards all his bones; Not one of them is broken.

How do we know none of his bones were broken?

Psalms 45:7-8

⁷ You love righteousness and hate wickedness; Therefore God, Your God, has anointed You with the oil of gladness more than Your companions.

⁸ All Your garments *are scented* with myrrh and aloes and cassia, out of the ivory palaces, by which they have made You glad.

What does Christ love?

Psalms 55:12-24

¹² For *it is* not an enemy *who* reproaches me; Then I could bear *it*. Nor *is it* one *who* hates me who has exalted *himself* against me; Then I could hide from him. ¹³ But *it was* you, a man my equal, my companion and my acquaintance. ¹⁴ We took sweet counsel together, *and* walked to the house of God in the throng. ¹⁵ Let death seize them; let them go down alive into hell, for wickedness *is* in their dwellings *and* among them. ¹⁶ As for me, I will call upon God, and the LORD shall save me. ¹⁷ Evening and morning and at noon I will pray, and cry aloud, and He shall hear my voice. ¹⁸ He has redeemed my soul in peace from the battle *that was* against me, for there were many against me. ¹⁹ God will hear, and afflict them, even He who abides from of old. Selah. Because they do

not change, therefore they do not fear God. ²⁰ He has put forth his hands against those who were at peace with him; He has broken his covenant. ²¹ *The words* of his mouth were smoother than butter, but war *was* in his heart; His words were softer than oil, yet they *were* drawn swords. ²² Cast your burden on the LORD, and He shall sustain you; He shall never permit the righteous to be moved. ²³ But You, O God, shall bring them down to the pit of destruction; Bloodthirsty and deceitful men shall not live out half their days; but I will trust in You.

How does this describe Jerusalem?

Psalms 68:18-19

¹⁸ You have ascended on high, You have led captivity captive; You have received gifts among men, even *from* the rebellious, that the LORD God might dwell *there*. ¹⁹ Blessed *be* the Lord, *who* daily loads us *with benefits*, the God of our salvation! Selah

How is Christ described here?

Psalms 69:4

⁴ Those who hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of my head; They are mighty who would destroy me, *being* my enemies wrongfully; Though I have stolen nothing, I *still* must restore *it*.

How many would hate Christ?

Psalms 69:8

I have become a stranger to my brothers, and an alien to my mother's children;

Explain Christ's family life.

Psalms 69:9-10

⁹ Because zeal for Your house has eaten me up, and the reproaches of those who reproach You have fallen on me. ¹⁰ When I wept *and chastened* my soul with fasting, that became my reproach

What did Christ do?

Psalms 69:21

They also gave me gall for my food, and for my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink.

When did this occur?

Psalms 72:10-11

¹⁰ The kings of Tarshish and of the isles will bring presents; the kings of Sheba and Seba will offer gifts. ¹¹ Yes, all kings shall fall down before Him; All nations shall serve Him.

When will kings bow down?

Psalms 78:2

I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings of old,

What parables did Christ use?

Psalms 89:3-4

³ “I have made a covenant with My chosen, I have sworn to My servant David: ⁴ “Your seed I will establish forever, and build up your throne to all generations.” Selah

How are we David's seed?

Psalms 110:1

The LORD said to my Lord, “Sit at My right hand, Till I make Your enemies Your footstool.”

Where is Christ today?

Psalms 110:4

The LORD has sworn and will not relent, “You *are* a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek.”

What is the significance of the order?

Psalms 118:22-23

²² The stone *which* the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. ²³ This was the LORD’s doing; *It is* marvelous in our eyes.

Cornerstone for what?

Psalms 118:26

Blessed *is* he who comes in the name of the LORD! We have blessed you from the house of the LORD.

How was Christ blessed?

Psalms 132:11

The LORD has sworn *in* truth to David, He will not turn from it: “I will set upon your throne the fruit of your body.

What throne is referred to here?

Proverbs 30:4

Who has ascended into heaven, or descended? Who has gathered the wind in His fists? Who has bound the waters in a garment? Who has established all the ends of the earth? What *is* His name, and what *is* His Son’s name, if you know?

Do you know the Son's name?

Zechariah 6:13

Yes, He shall build the temple of the LORD. He shall bear the glory, and shall sit and rule on His throne; So He shall be a priest on His throne, and the counsel of peace shall be between them both.

Explain the temple.

Zechariah 9:9

Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

How was this fulfilled?

Zechariah 13:7

“Awake, O sword, against My Shepherd, against the Man who is My Companion,” Says the LORD of hosts. “ Strike the Shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered; then I will turn My hand against the little ones.

How was the Shepherd struck?

Jeremiah 23:5-6

⁵ “Behold, *the* days are coming,” says the LORD, “That I will raise to David a Branch of righteousness; A King shall reign and prosper, And execute judgment and righteousness in the earth. ⁶ In His days Judah will be saved, and Israel will dwell safely; now this *is* His name by which He will be called: THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS
How is Israel dwelling safely?

Daniel 9:24-26

²⁴ “Seventy weeks are determined for your people and for your holy city, to finish the transgression, to make an end of sins, make reconciliation for iniquity, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal up vision and prophecy, and to anoint the Most Holy. ²⁵ “Know therefore and understand, *that* from the going forth of the command to restore and build Jerusalem until Messiah the Prince, *There shall be* seven weeks and sixty-two weeks; the street shall be built again, and the wall, even in troublesome times. ²⁶ “And after the sixty-two weeks Messiah shall be cut off, but not for Himself; And the people of the prince who is to come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary the

end of it *shall be* with a flood, and till the end of the war desolations are determined.

Explain the Messiah the Prince

Zechariah 6:13

Yes, He shall build the temple of the LORD. He shall bear the glory, and shall sit and rule on His throne; so He shall be a priest on His throne, and the counsel of peace shall be between them both.”

What is the throne?

Zechariah 9:9

“Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; He *is* just and having salvation, lowly and riding on a donkey, a colt, the foal of a donkey

When did Christ ride a donkey?

Zechariah 11:12-13

¹² Then I said to them, “If it is agreeable to you, give *me* my wages; and if not, refrain.” So they weighed out for my wages thirty *pieces* of silver.

¹³ And the LORD said to me, “Throw it to the potter”—that princely price they set on me. So I took the thirty *pieces* of silver and threw them into the house of the LORD for the potter.

When did this occur?

Zechariah 12:10

“And I will pour on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem the Spirit of grace and supplication; then they will look on Me whom they pierced. Yes, they will mourn for Him as one mourns for *his* only *son*, and grieve for Him as one grieves for a firstborn.

When was this occurring?

Zechariah 13:7

"Awake, O sword, against my shepherd, against the man who is close to me!" declares the LORD Almighty. "Strike the shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered, and I will turn my hand against the little ones.

How was Jesus stuck?

Hosea 6:2

After two days He will revive us; On the third day He will raise us up, that we may live in His sight.

What happened on the third day?

Micah 5:1-2

¹ Now gather yourself in troops, O daughter of troops; He has laid siege against us; they will strike the judge of Israel with a rod on the cheek. ² “But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, *though* you are little among the thousands of Judah, *Yet* out of you shall come forth to Me the One to be Ruler in Israel, Whose goings forth *are* from of old, from everlasting.”

How long ago does Christ exist?

Jonah 1:7

And they said to one another, “Come, let us cast lots, that we may know for whose cause this trouble *has come* upon us.” So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah.

When were lots cast for Christ's garments?

Haggai 2:7-9

⁷ and I will shake all nations, and they shall come to the Desire of All Nations, and I will fill this temple with glory,’ says the LORD of hosts. ⁸ ‘The silver *is* Mine, and the gold *is* Mine,’ says the LORD of hosts. ⁹ ‘The glory of this latter temple shall be greater than the former,’ says the LORD of hosts. ‘And in this place I will give peace,’ says the LORD of hosts.”

What is the latter temple?

Malachi 3:1

¹ “Behold, I send My messenger, and he will prepare the way before Me. And the Lord, whom you seek, will suddenly come to His temple, even the Messenger of the covenant, in whom you delight. Behold, He is coming,” Says the LORD of hosts.

Explain the coming of Christ?

Malachi 4:5

Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the LORD.

When was the great and dreadful day?
