SERMON: Why I Love the Lord! TEXT: Psalm 116:1, "I love the Lord!"

Intro: The greatest command is-"Love the Lord" with everything you have (i.e., with all heart, mind, soul and strength) and we love Him because He first loved us! There are reasons for loving the Lord. Notice...

- 1. I love the Lord because He is so good to me (Romans 2:4). See Psalm 107:1; 31:19; Hosea 3:5. The goodness of God is not only an attribute of God but a foundational truth every Christian should embrace. Thank God for His goodness!
- 2. I love the Lord because He never breaks a promise (Psalm 89:34). The strength of any promise is based upon the ability of the promise maker to fulfil the promise made. Hebrews 10:23, "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful." God keeps every promise made!
- 3. I love the Lord because He gives to all especially the undeserving (Romans 5:8). We are not deserving of God's love; we are not worthy to be loved by Him; we are most unlovable. Even so, "God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." God's love is agape love!
- 4. I love the Lord because He teaches me how to love and forgive (Ephesians 4:32). I know how to love and forgive because I've learn how to love and forgive: God is my teacher. As I love and forgive like God, I am fulfilling His will. Illustration: A college student made an appointment with her preacher. She wanted to know God's will for her life. She explained to him that she prayed often to know God's will, but she was not making any progress. After a lengthy conversation, he said, "Would you do God's will if you knew it?" She paused and smiled, then she said, "Well, it depends on what it is." The preacher responded, "That may be the reason you don't know God's will." Cf. James 1:22.
- 5. I love the Lord because He wants me even when others may not (John 3:16). John 3:16 tells us of the love God has for us and the extent of that loveso great that He sacrificed His only begotten Son on our behalf. In the short epistles, John says that Jesus died for the sins of the "whole world" (1 John 2:2). God's grace is universally available to all that will "receive it" (2 Cor. 6:2). Con: Sin need not be a barrier between God and man, if man will obey Jesus!

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Things I want to give MYSELF for Christmas

It was priceless! I was in Walmart recently and saw a little boy secretly lifting a toy over into the shopping cart as his mother was looking the other way. She turned just in time to see it fall in and said, "Derek, what are you doing? You know Christmas is almost here. We can't buy that today." To which

he replied, "But mom, I want to get ME this for Christmas." I had to laugh and say under my breath, "At-a-boy!" Since then I've thought long about that scene and decided that there are some things I want to give MYSELF for Christmas; not physical, but spiritual. Consider the following:

- 1. I want to give myself a GREATER FAITH IN THE PROVISIONS OF GOD. God provides all our needs (Phil. 4:19). We shouldn't think that the Philippians were wealthy benefactors of Paul who could easily spare the money. As Paul described them in 2 Corinthians 8, it is plain that their giving was sacrificial. This promise meant something to them! The promise is to supply ALL your need; but it is all you NEED (not a promise to go beyond needs). In this, the promise is both broad and yet restricted.
- 2. I want to give myself a GREATER HOPE IN THE PROMISES OF GOD. God is faithful and true in everything that He says and does. You can count on the promises of God in the Bible to be absolutely trustworthy. Christians draw great hope from the words of the well-known song "Standing on the Promises of God." Cf. 2 Pet. 1:4; Heb. 6:12; 10:23. Read Romans 4:19-21. The promises of God don't depend on our abilities, but God's. Abraham was 100, Sarah 90 when Isaac was born. They themselves had ZERO ability to bear children. The key was Abraham's confidence that GOD had power to DO what He had PROMISED.
- 3. I want to give myself a GREATER LOVE FOR THE PERSON OF GOD. The strongest message in the Bible is God's love in redeeming man through Jesus Christ. Everything revolves around God's love. God, who created the universe by His Word, is the source of love, which is love in its truest, purest and perfect form. Thus, we love because He first loved us (1 John 4:19). Let us grasp how wide and long and high and deep the love of God is. God's love endures forever (Psalm 118:1). The earth is filled with God's love (Psalm 119:64). His love is even better than life (Psalm 63:3) and surpasses knowledge (Ephesians 3:18). Cf. Romans 8:38-39.

SERMON: God's Promises! TEXT: 7 Peter 1:4

- Exceedingly (adverb) from megistos. God's 1. promises exceed our imagination, understanding and comprehension.
- Great (adjective) from megistos. God's 2. promises are great because the come from a Great God.
- 3. Precious (adjective) from timia. God's promises are precious because they are so 4. valuable.

SERMON: How Bold are you? TEXT: Heb 10:19-25 Because of the Blood of Jesus...

- Let Us draw near (10:22): In faith!
- Let Us hold fast (10:23): In Hope! 2.

- 3. COURSE of temptation (v.15): drawn away, enticed, lusts, conception, birth, death. That's
- a process! 4. REMORSE of temptation (v.15b): "brings forth
- death!" Nothing sadder than spiritual death!
- 5. RECOURSE of temptation (v.17): The only help in this difficult time is GOD!

SERMON: Overcoming Anger! TEXT: Luke 15:29

- Listen to the pleas of the Father (v.28). 1.
- 2. Don't feel sorry for yourself! (vs.29-30).
- 3. Don't allow bitterness to grow (vs.29-30).
- Remember that God loves you (vs.31).
- 5 Think of others! (v.32).

SERMON: How to Overcome Materialism! **TEXT:** 1 Timothy 6:17-19

- Intro: Are you rich? Cf. context vs. 6-16.
- Look inward at yourself (v. 17). 1.
- Look outward at others (v.18). 2.

3. Look forward at the future (v.19). Conclusion: Read Matthew 19:16-26

Conclusion: The best remedy for greed is generosity.

SERMON: Stewardship! TEXT: 1 Cor. 4:2

- 1. Ownership Principle (Ps. 24:1). This is the fundamental principle of biblical stewardship. God owns everything; we are simply managers or administrators acting on his behalf.
- 2. Responsibility Principle (Eccl. 12:13). We are responsible to manage God's holdings well & according to his desires & purposes.
- 3. Accountability Principle (Matt. 25:19). We are all stewards of the resources, abilities & opportunities that God has entrusted to our care, and one day everyone will be called to give an account for how we have managed what the Master has given us.
- 4. Reward Principle (Matt. 25:21). This verse tells us that faithful stewards who do the master's will with the master's resources can expect to be rewarded incompletely in this life, but fully in the next.

Con: We must be faithful stewards of all God has given us within the opportunities presented to alorify him, serve the common good & further the Kingdom.
